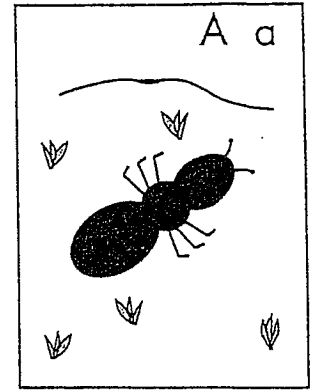

Materials:

Background	1 Chartreuse rectangle	9"	x	12"

Abdomen	1 Black rectangle	2"	x	3"
Thorax	1 Black square	1 1/2"	x	1 1/2"
Head	1 Black rectangle	1 1/2"	x	2"
Green and black crayons, pencil				

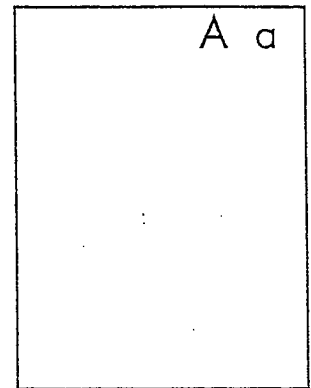


Vocabulary: insect, six, abdomen, thorax, head, chartreuse

Directions:

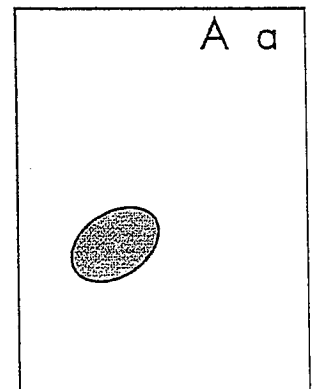
1. Background/letter: chartreuse rectangle and letter

- Place the chartreuse rectangle on the table in a vertical position
- Put a dot of glue on each corner of the back of the letter; glue the letter to the chartreuse rectangle; place it in the upper right corner



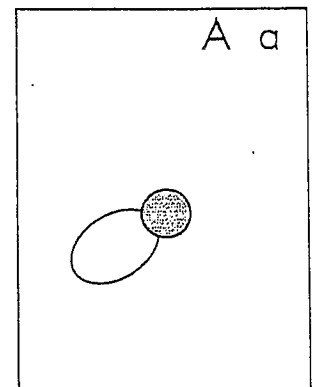
2. Abdomen: larger black rectangle

- Cut off the corners of the black rectangle and round to make an oval for the abdomen
- Put a dot of glue on the abdomen; glue the abdomen to the chartreuse rectangle in a diagonal position; place it a little below the middle of the rectangle on the left side



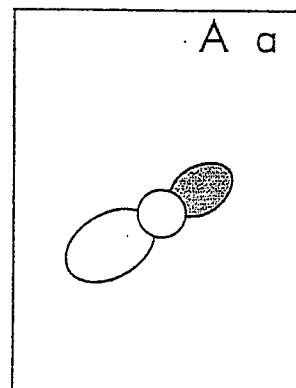
3. Thorax: black square

- Cut off the corners of the black square and round to make a circle for the thorax
- Put a dot of glue on the thorax; glue the thorax to the chartreuse rectangle; make it overlap the abdomen a little



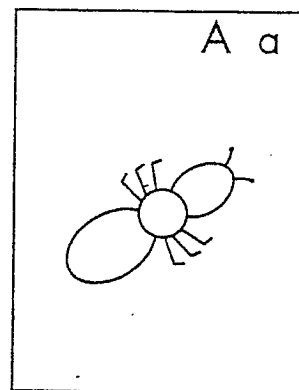
4. Head: smaller black rectangle

- Cut off the corners of the black rectangle and round to make a oval for the head
- Put a dot of glue on the head; lift the thorax and glue the head under the thorax



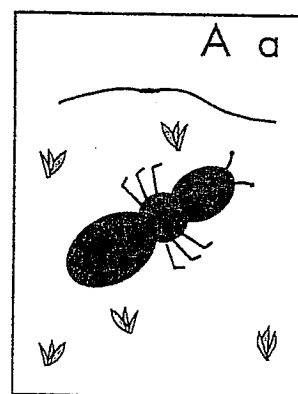
5. Legs/antenna: black crayon

- An ant is an insect so it will need six legs
- Draw three legs on one side of the thorax and three legs on the other side of the thorax
- Draw two lines on the head for the antennae



6. Base line/grass: green crayon

- Draw a horizontal line above the ant; make it curved like a small hill; make it go from one side of the page to the other not quite touching the sides of the rectangle
- Draw some tufts of grass with a green crayon



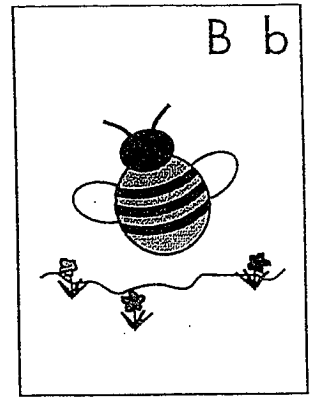

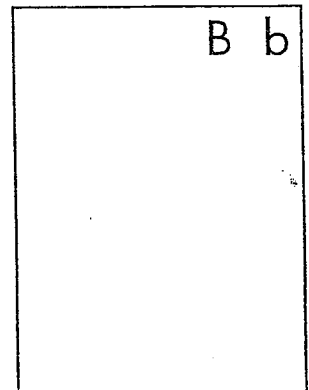

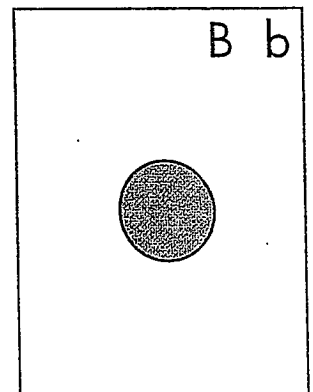
1. Background/letter: blue rectangle and letter

- Place the blue rectangle on the table in a vertical position
- Put a dot of glue on each corner of the back of the letter; glue the letter to the blue rectangle; place it in the upper right corner



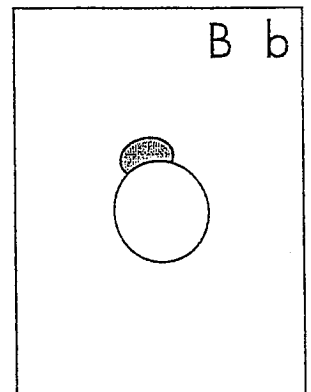
2. Body: yellow square

- Cut off the corners of the square and round to make a circle for the body
- Put a dot of glue on the body; glue the body to the blue rectangle; place it in the middle of the rectangle



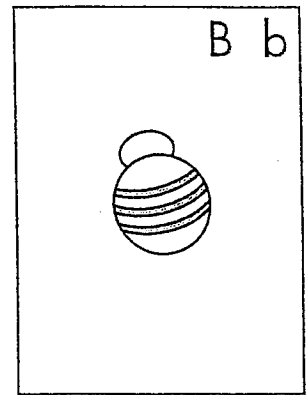
3. Head: shorter black rectangle

- Cut off the corners of the rectangle and round to make an oval for the head
- Put a dot of glue on the head; lift the body and glue the head under the body in a horizontal position



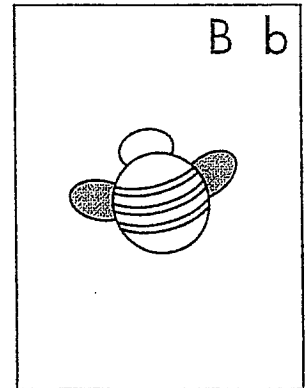
4. Stripes: longer black rectangle

- Hold the rectangle in a horizontal position; cut off the top corners and round
- Cut three strips from the rectangle following the shape of the top of the rounded rectangle
- Put a dot of glue on each end of one of the stripes; glue the stripe to the middle of the body; make it curve downward
- Glue the other two stripes to the body in the same way; place one above the first stripe and one below it



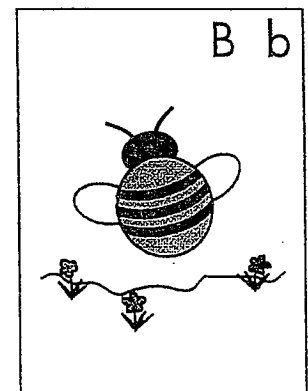
5. Wings: white tissue rectangle

- Fold the rectangle; cut off the corners and round to make two ovals for the wings
- Put a dot of glue on one end of one of the wings; lift the body and glue the wing under the body on the left side
- Glue the other wing under the right side of the body in the same way



6. Antennae/grass/flowers: crayons

- Use a black crayon to make antennae on the head
- Use a green crayon to draw a base line across the blue rectangle under the bee
- Use bright colors to make three flowers under or on the base line



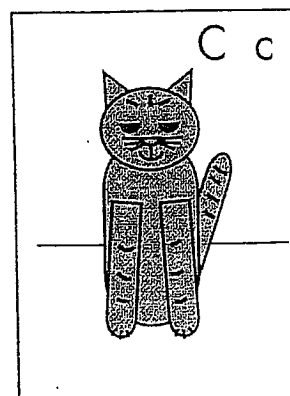

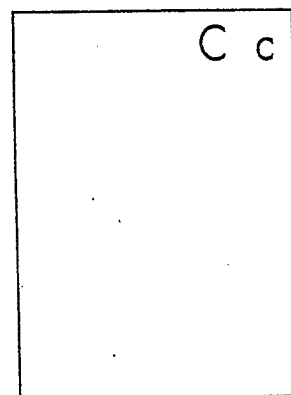

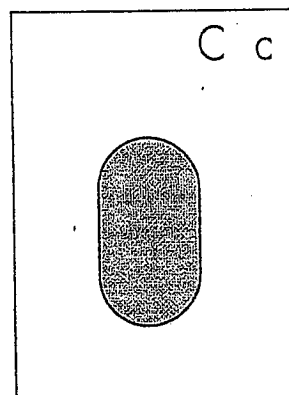
1. **Background/letter:** white rectangle and letter

- Place the white rectangle on the table in a vertical position
- Put a dot of glue on each corner of the back of the letter; glue the letter to the white rectangle; place it in the upper right corner



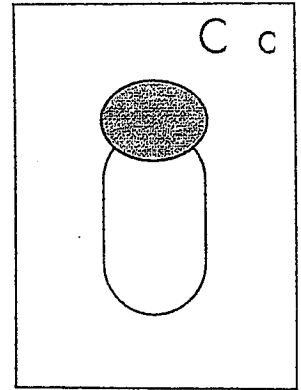
2. **Body:** largest orange rectangle

- Cut off the corners of the rectangle and round to make an oval for the body
- Put a dot of glue on each end of the body; glue the body to the white rectangle in a vertical position; place it in the middle of the rectangle



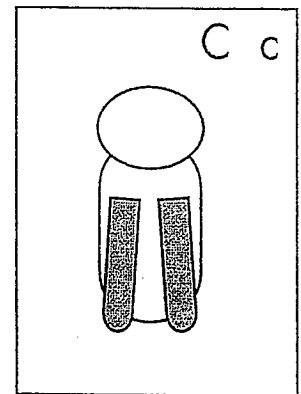
3. Head: next-largest or widest rectangle

- Cut off the corners of the rectangle and round to make an oval for the head
- Put a dot of glue on the head; glue the head to the body in a horizontal position; make it overlap the body a little



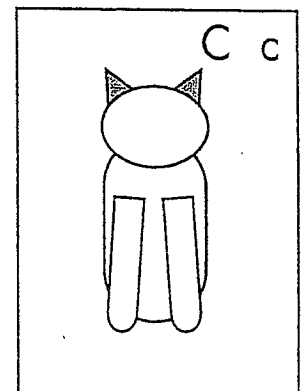
4. Legs: longer orange rectangle

- Fold the rectangle in half; hold the folded rectangle in a vertical position; cut off the top corners and round; open and cut on the fold line to make two legs
- Put a dot of glue on each end of one of the legs; glue the leg to one side of the body with the rounded end down; the rounded end of the leg should extend off of the body about an inch; glue the other leg to the other side of the body in the same way



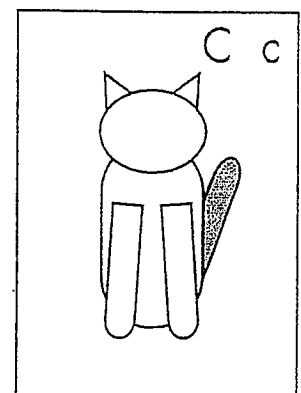
5. Ears: small orange square

- Cut the square on a diagonal line from corner to corner to make two triangles for the ears
- Put a dot of glue on the back of each ear; lift the head and glue the ears under the head with the points sticking up; place them near the outer edges of the top of the head



6. Tail: orange rectangle

- Hold the rectangle in a vertical position; cut off the top corners and round to make the tail
- Put a dot of glue on each end of the tail
- Lift the body and glue the tail under the body; glue it near the bottom with the rounded end slanting up

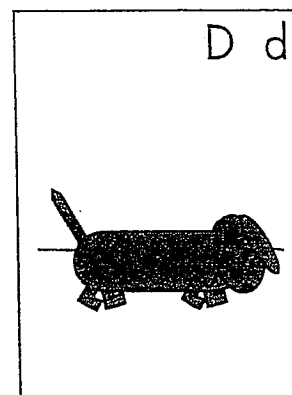

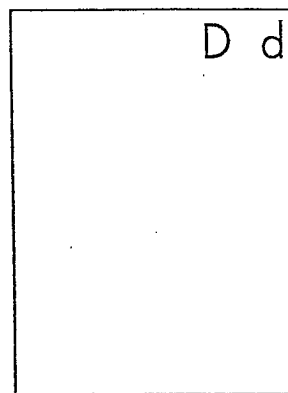

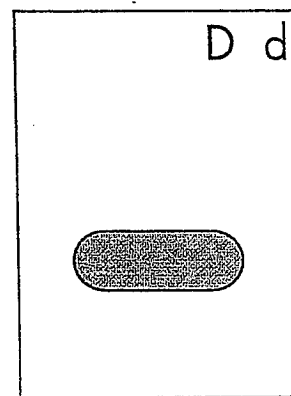
1. Background/letter: yellow rectangle and letter

- Place the yellow rectangle on the table in a vertical position
- Put a dot of glue on each corner of the back of the letter; glue the letter to the yellow rectangle; place it in the upper right corner



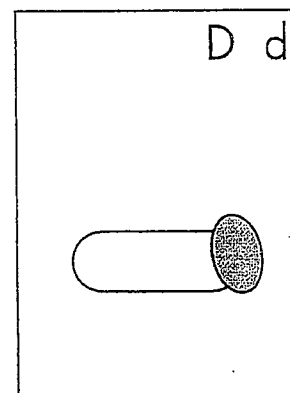
2. Body: largest brown rectangle

- Cut off the corners of the rectangle and round to make a long oval for the body
- Put a dot of glue on each end of the body; glue the body to the yellow rectangle in a horizontal position; place it in the middle of the rectangle



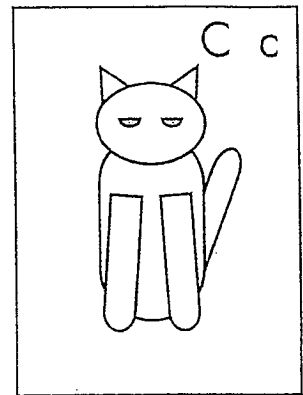
3. Head: next-largest rectangle

- Cut off the corners of the rectangle and round to make an oval for the head
- Put a dot of glue on each end of the head; glue the head to the body in a vertical position; make it overlap the body a little; slant it back a little



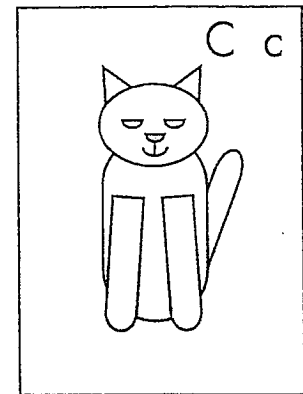
7. Eyes: black square

- Cut off the corners of the square to make a circle; cut the circle in half to make two semicircles for the eyes
- Put a dot of glue on each eye; glue the eyes to the cat's head in a horizontal position with the rounded side down; place one on each side near the middle of the head



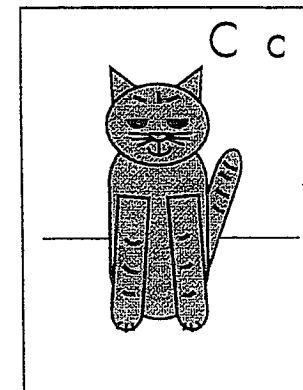
8. Nose: pink rectangle

- Hold the rectangle in a horizontal position; cut off the top corners and round to make a semicircle for the nose
- Put a dot of glue on the nose; glue the nose to the cat's head; place it below the eyes with the round side down
- Use a black crayon to make a short vertical line under the nose; make a small "U", a smile, at the bottom end of the vertical line for the cat's mouth



9. Base line/markings: orange and black crayons

- Use a black crayon to draw whiskers on the cat's face; draw three whiskers on each side of the nose
- Use an orange crayon to make markings on the cat; make three horizontally-curved lines on each leg; make curved lines on the cat's tail; draw a vertical line from the middle of the top of the cat's toward the nose; make slanted lines above the cat's eyes
- Use a black crayon to make three claws on the end of each leg
- Use a black crayon to draw a base line across the middle of the page; make it look as if it goes behind the cat

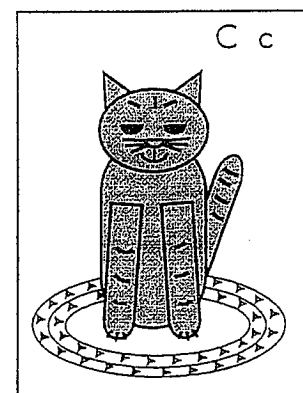


10. Name: pencil

- Turn your picture over and write your name in small letters in the bottom left corner

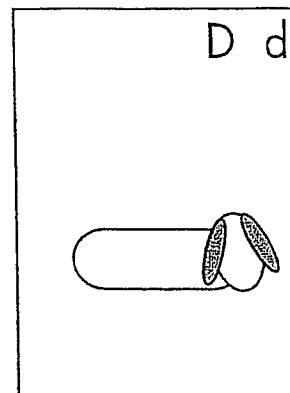
11. Rug (optional): crayons

- Instead of a base line, use crayons to make ovals around the bottom of the cat to make it look as if he is sitting on a rug; use different colors to make a pattern on the rug



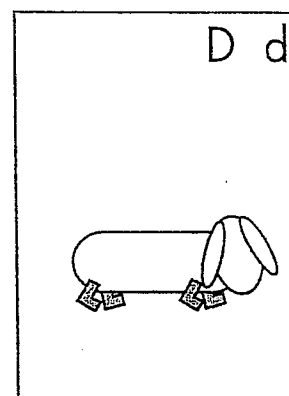
4. Ears: tan rectangle

- Fold the rectangle in half; cut off the corners of the folded rectangle and round to make two ovals for the ears
- Put a dot of glue on one end of one of the ears; glue the ear to the head; place it near the top of the head on the left side; slant it outward a little
- Glue the other ear to the right side of the head in the same way



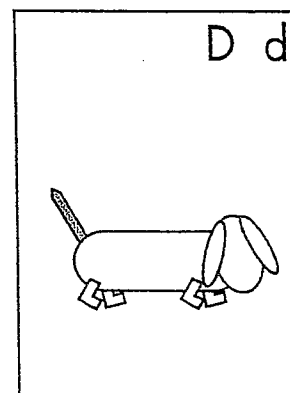
5. Legs: longer brown rectangle

- Fold the rectangle in half two times; open and cut apart on the fold lines to make four rectangles for the legs
- Hold one of the rectangles in a vertical position to make it into an "L" shape; starting at the bottom make a vertical cut in the rectangle, stopping a little way from the top; make a horizontal cut from the edge to the end of the cut to make an "L" shape
- Put a dot of glue on the top end of the leg; glue it on the body near the back
- * Make another leg in the same way; lift the body and glue the leg under the body near the other back leg
- Make the front legs the same way; glue them in the same way to the front of the body



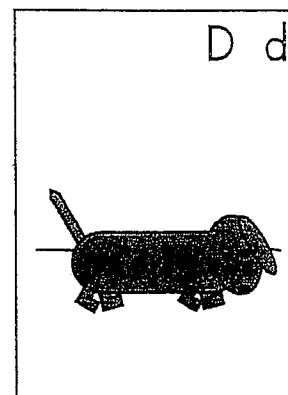
6. Tail: brown rectangle

- Hold the rectangle in a vertical position; cut off the top corners to make a point
- Put a dot of glue on the straight end of the tail; lift the body and glue the tail under the back of the body; make it point up



7. Eyes/nose/base line: black crayon

- Use a black crayon to make two black circles for the eyes
- Use a black crayon to make a circle for the nose at the bottom of the head
- Use a black crayon to make a base line behind the dog



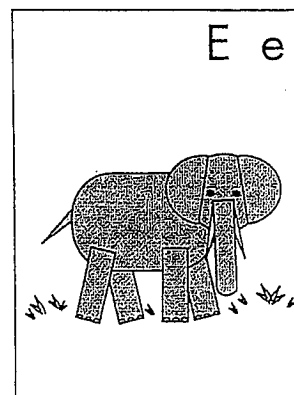

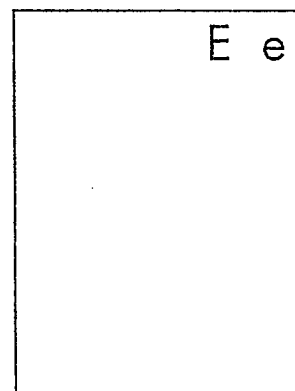

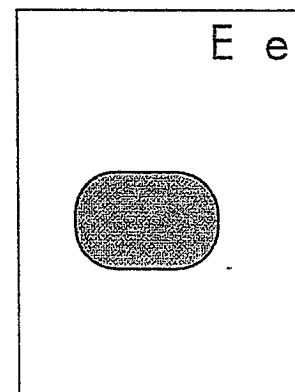
1. **Background/letter:** chartreuse rectangle and letter

- Place the chartreuse rectangle on the table in a vertical position
- Put a dot of glue on each corner of the back of the letter; glue the letter to the chartreuse rectangle; place it in the upper right corner



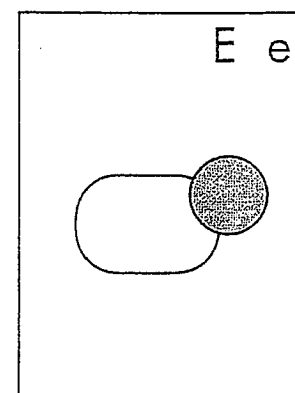
2. **Body:** largest gray rectangle

- Cut off the corners of the rectangle and round to make an oval for the body
- Put a dot of glue on each end of the body; glue the body to the chartreuse rectangle in a horizontal position; place it in the middle of the rectangle, a little closer to the left side



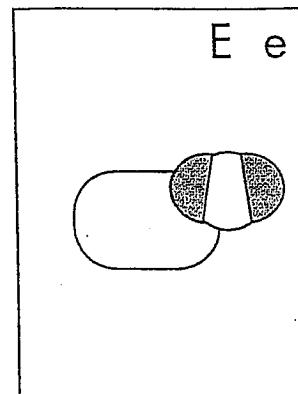
3. **Head:** gray square

- Cut off the corners of the square and round to make a circle for the head
- Put a dot of glue on the head; glue the head to the body; make it overlap the body a little



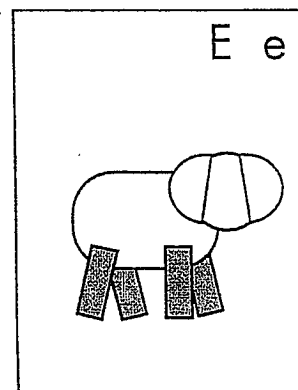
4. Ears: wider gray rectangle

- Fold the rectangle in half crosswise; hold the folded rectangle in a horizontal position; cut off the top corners and round; open and cut on the fold line to make two ears
- Put a dot of glue on each side of the head; glue the ears to the head with the rounded sides out



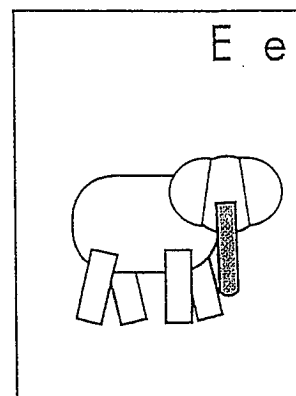
5. Legs: longer gray rectangle

- Fold the rectangle twice; open and cut apart on the fold lines to make four smaller rectangles for the legs
- Put a dot of glue on one end of one of the legs; lift the front of the elephant's body and glue the leg under the body, slanting it forward a little
- Put a dot of glue on the one end of another leg; glue the leg on top of the elephant's body; place it next to the first leg; slant it backward a little
- Put a dot of glue on a third leg; lift the elephant's body and glue the leg under the body; place it near the back of the body and slant it forward a little
- Put a dot of glue on the last leg; glue the leg to the top of the elephant's body; place it near the other back leg; slant it backward a little



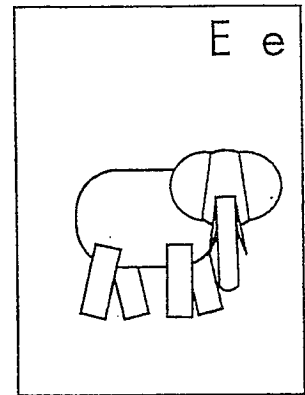
6. Trunk: long gray rectangle

- Hold the rectangle in a vertical position; cut off the top corners and round to make the trunk
- Put a dot of glue on the straight end of the trunk
- Glue the trunk to the elephant's head; place it near the middle of the head with the round end pointing down



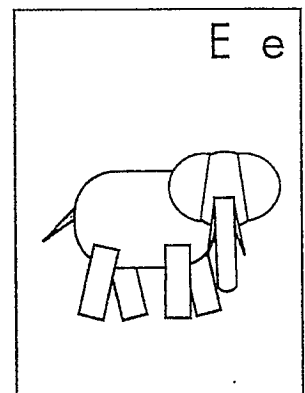
7. Tusks: white rectangle

- Cut the rectangle on a diagonal line from corner to corner to make two triangles for the tusks
- Put a dot of glue on the straight end of each tusk; lift the trunk and glue the tusks under the trunk, one on each side; make them slant out a little



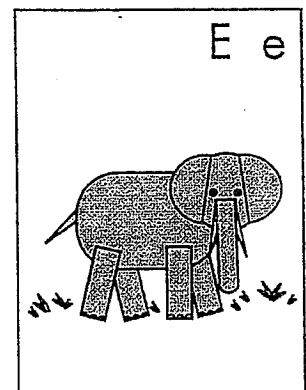
8. Tail: gray scrap

- Cut a scrap of gray into a tail, rectangular or triangular; make it a little more than an inch long
- Put a dot of glue on one end of the tail; lift the back of the body and glue the tail under the body



9. Eyes/hooves/grass: green and black crayons

- Use a black crayon to make two small black eyes on the elephant's head
- Use a black crayon to make hooves on each leg; draw three upside down "U"'s on the bottom of each leg
- Use a green crayon to make some tufts of grass on the chartreuse rectangle; place them on both sides of the elephant near his feet



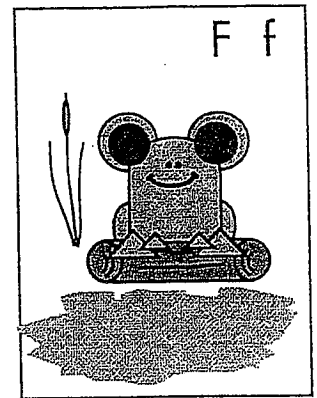

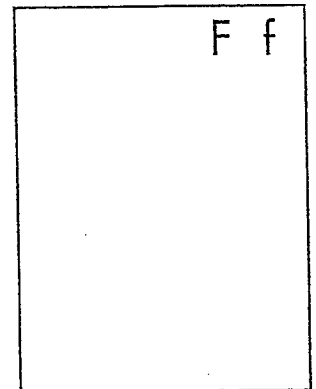

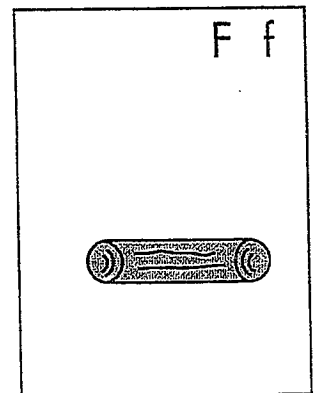
1. Background/letter: white rectangle and letter

- Place the white rectangle on the table in a vertical position
- Put a dot of glue on each corner of the back of the letter; glue the letter to the white rectangle; place it in the upper right corner



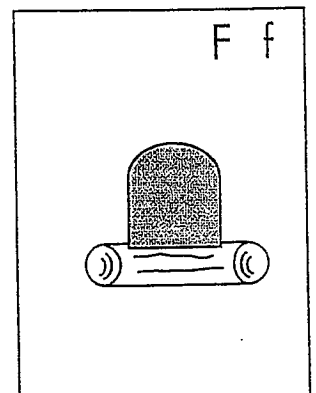
2. Log: brown rectangle

- Cut off the corners of the rectangle and round to make a long oval for the log
- Put a dot of glue on each end of the log; glue the log to the white rectangle in a horizontal position; place it in the middle of the rectangle a little closer to the bottom of the rectangle
- Use a brown crayon to mark the log; make a curved line at each end to make an oval; make two smaller curved lines inside each oval



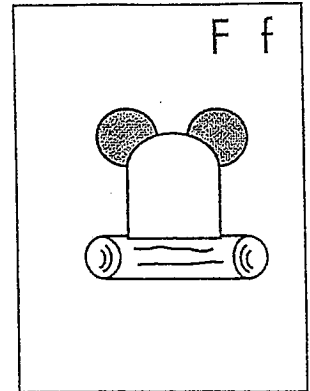
3. Body: larger green rectangle

- Hold the rectangle in a vertical position; cut off the top corners and round for the top of the frog
- Put a dot of glue on the body; glue the body to the white rectangle in a vertical position with the rounded end at the top; make it overlap the log a little



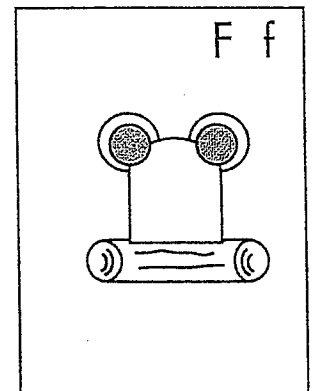
4. Eyes (back): smaller green rectangle

- Fold the rectangle in half; cut off the corners of the folded rectangle and round to make two circles for the eyes
- Put a dot of glue near the edge of one circle; lift up the frog's body and glue the circle underneath it on the left side; glue the other circle in the same way on the right side



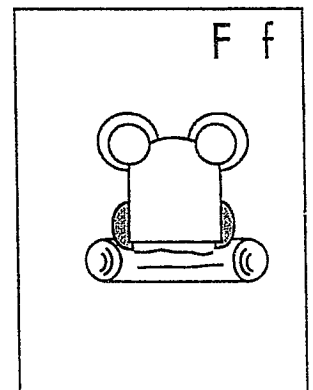
5. Eyes: black rectangle

- Fold the rectangle in half; cut off the corners of the folded rectangle and round to make two circles for the eyes
- Put a dot of glue on each black eye; glue the black circles on the top corners of the body; make them fit inside the green circles



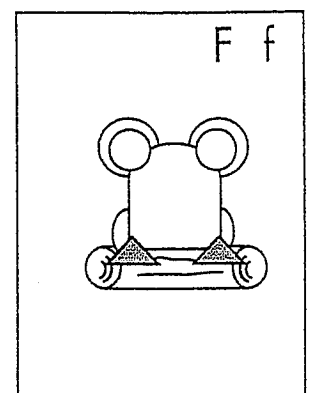
6. Hind legs: biggest green square

- Cut off the corners of the square and round to make a circle; fold the circle, open it and cut apart on the fold to make two semicircles
- Put a dot of glue on the straight edge of one of the semicircles; lift the body and glue the semicircle under the left side with the curved part showing at the side; a little of the semicircle should show at the bottom of the body
- Glue the other semicircle on the right side of the body in the same way



7. Hind feet: middle-sized green square

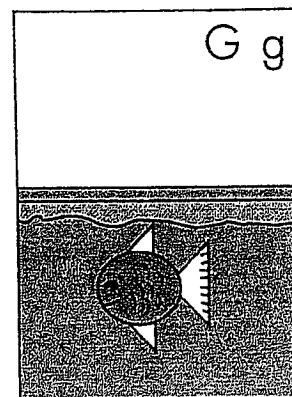
- Cut the square on a diagonal line from corner to corner to make two triangles for the feet
- Put a dot of glue on the bottom corners of the body; glue the triangles to the body; place them so a point of each triangle is up and a straight edge of each triangle is at the bottom

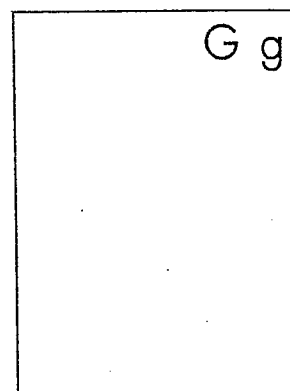

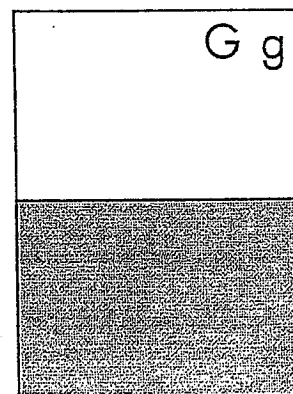
1. Background/letter: white rectangle and letter

- Place the white rectangle on the table in a vertical position
- Put a dot of glue on each corner of the back of the letter; glue the letter to the white rectangle; place it in the upper right corner



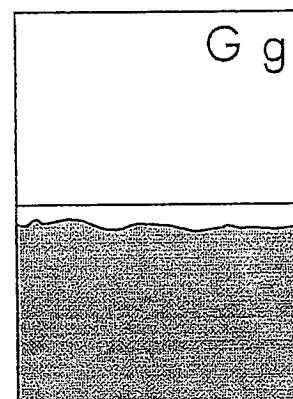
2. Aquarium: light blue rectangle

- Put a dot of glue on each corner of the rectangle; glue the light blue rectangle to the white rectangle in a horizontal position; match the bottom edges and the sides so that none of the white rectangle shows



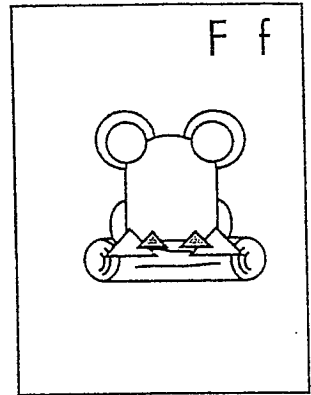
3. Water: turquoise rectangle

- Hold the rectangle in a vertical position; tear off a narrow strip on one side of the rectangle
- Put a dot of glue on each corner of the rectangle; glue the turquoise rectangle to the light blue rectangle in a horizontal position with the torn edge at the top; match the bottom edges and the sides so that none of the light blue rectangle shows



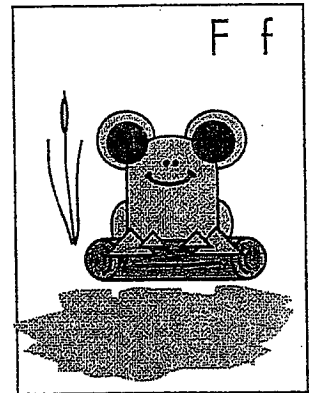
8. Front feet: smallest green square

- Cut the square on a diagonal line from corner to corner to make two triangles for the feet
- Put a dot of glue on the back of each triangle; glue the triangles to the bottom of the body; place them so a point of each triangle is up and a straight edge of each triangle is at the bottom; make them overlap the hind feet a little



9. Water/cattail/markings: green, blue, brown and black crayons

- Use a black crayon to make a big smile on the frog; put two small dots between the eyes for the frog's nostrils
- To make the stem of the cattail use a green crayon to draw a vertical line next to the left side of the frog; make a slanted line on each side of the stem for the leaves
- Use a brown crayon to make the cattail; make a long thin oval on top of the stem; use a black crayon to make a short vertical line on top of the oval
- * Use the side of a blue crayon to make some water at the bottom of the page, under the log

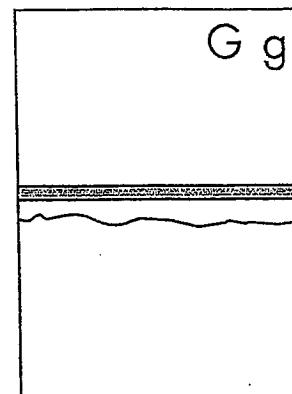


10. Name: pencil

- Turn your picture over and write your name in small letters in the bottom left corner

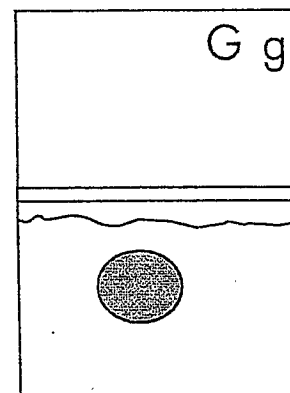
4. Rim: gray rectangle

- Put a dot of glue on each end of the gray rectangle; glue the gray rectangle to the top of the light blue rectangle; make it overlap the light blue rectangle just a little



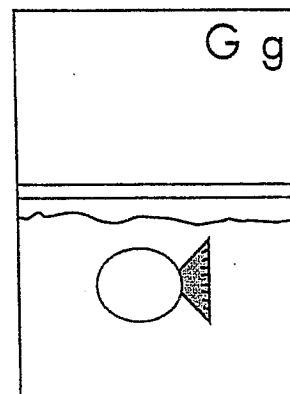
5. Body: orange rectangle

- Cut off the corners of the rectangle and round to make an oval for the fish's body
- Put a dot of glue on the body; glue the body to the water; place it so there will be room for a fin on the top



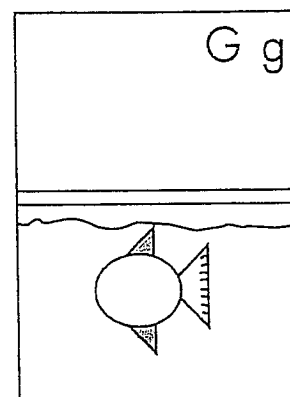
6. Tail: yellow square

- Cut the square on a diagonal line from corner to corner to make two triangles
- Use one of the triangles for the tail; save the other triangle for the fins
- Hold one of the triangles by the point; fringe the wide side of the triangle, make small cuts on that side
- Put a dot of glue on the point of the triangle; lift the body and glue the fin under the body with the point under the body and the fringe at the back



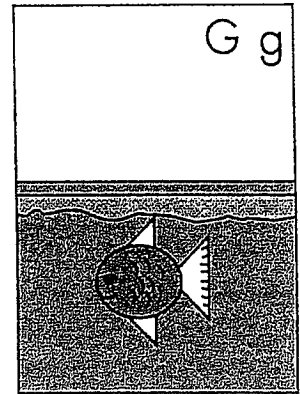
7. Fins: triangle saved from Step 6

- Cut the triangle in half, from the point to the opposite wide side to make two smaller triangles
- Put a dot of glue on the point of the triangle; lift the body and glue the fin under the body; place it at the top with one point of the triangle under the body and the opposite point sticking up
- Make the other fin the same way; glue the fin under the bottom of the body



8. Eye/mouth: black crayon

- Use a black crayon to make a circle for the fish's eye
- Use a black crayon to make a mouth for the fish
- Use a black crayon to make some scales on the body



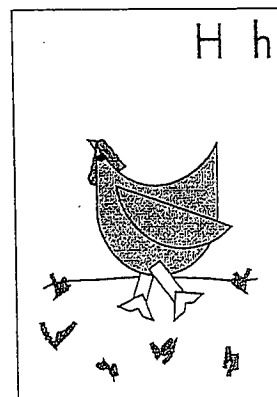

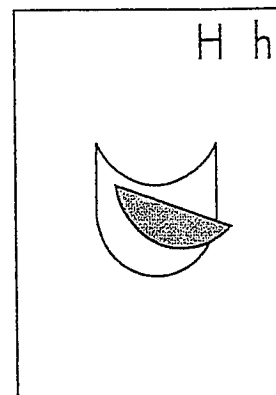
2. Body: brown rectangle

- Cut a wide "U" shape out of the top side; cut from one side corner to the other side corner; save this piece for the wing
- Hold the other piece with the "U" cut at the bottom; cut off the top corners and round
- Put two dots of glue on the back of the body; glue the body to the middle of the light blue rectangle with the "U" cut at the top



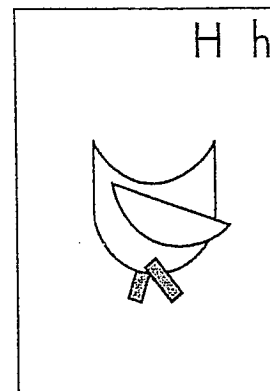
3. Wing: piece saved from step 1

- Put a dot of glue on each end of the wing; glue the wing to the body with the straight edge at the top; place the wing in the middle of the body; slant it downward a little with the end of the wing off the body



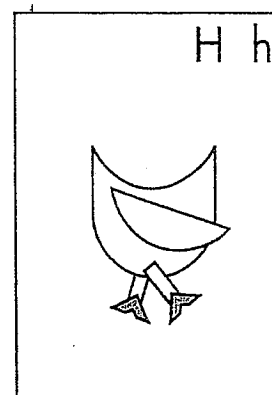
4. Legs: yellow rectangle

- Fold the rectangle in half; open and cut apart on the fold line to make two smaller rectangles for the legs
- Put a dot of glue on one of the legs; lift the bottom of the body; glue the leg under the body near the middle; make it slant forward a little
- Glue the other leg the same way; make it slant backward a little



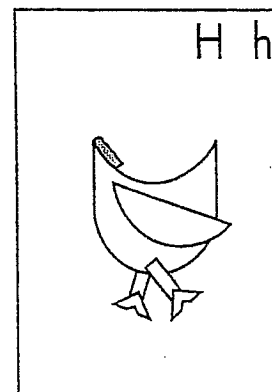
5. Feet: larger yellow square

- Cut the square on a diagonal line from corner to corner to make two triangles for the feet; make a small upside-down "V" cut in the wide side of each triangle
- Put a dot of glue on the end of each leg; glue the feet to the legs with the "V" cut at the bottom



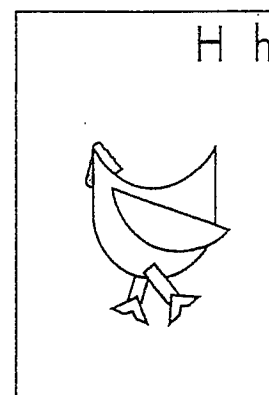
6. Comb: red rectangle

- Fold the rectangle; open and cut apart to make two smaller rectangles; save one of the rectangles for the wattle
- Cut off the corners of one of the rectangles and round; make small cuts on one side of the rectangle to make it look uneven
- Put a dot of glue on the comb; lift the head and glue the comb under the head in a slanted position; place the comb at the top of the head with the uneven edge showing



7. Wattle: rectangle saved from Step 6

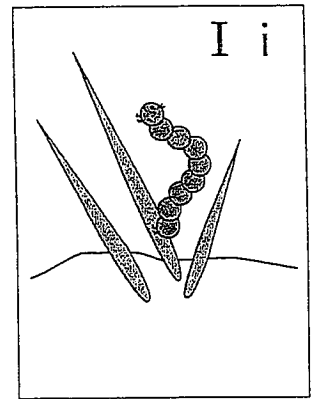
- Cut off the corners of the rectangle and round; make small cuts on one side of the rectangle to make it look uneven
- Put a dot of glue on the wattle; lift the head and glue the wattle under the head in a vertical position; place the wattle under the side of the head with the uneven edge showing

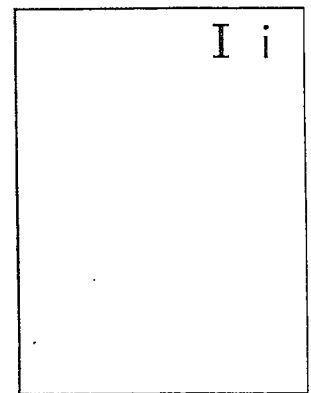

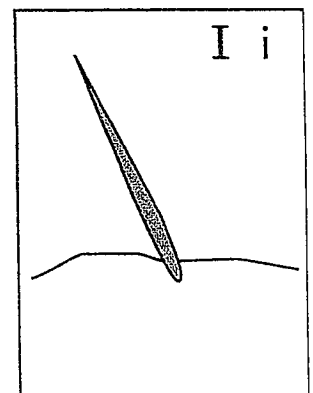
1. Background/letter: white rectangle and letter

- Place the white rectangle on the table in a vertical position
- Put a dot of glue on each corner of the back of the letter; glue the letter to the white rectangle; place it in the upper right corner



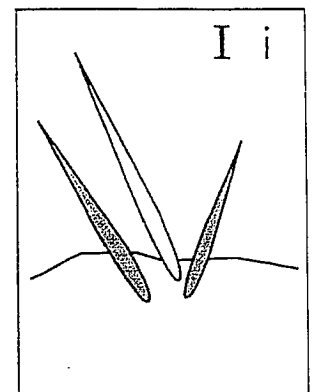
2. Base line/blade of grass: green crayon and shorter dark green rectangle

- Use a green crayon to draw a line from one side of the white rectangle to the other side of the white rectangle for the base line; place it near the middle of the white rectangle
- Hold the dark green rectangle in a vertical position; cut off the top corners and round; turn the rectangle upside-down; cut off the corners to make a point; start the cuts about three inches from the top so the blade of grass is tapered
- Put a dot of glue on each end of the blade of grass; glue the blade of grass in a to the white rectangle in a slanted position with the point at the top; place it a little below the base line



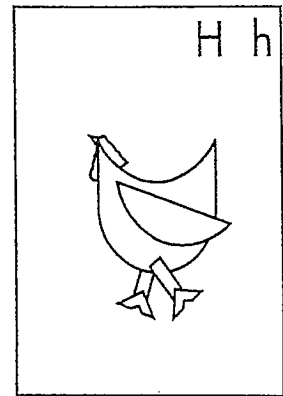
3. Blades of grass: longer dark green rectangle

- Fold the rectangle; open and cut apart on the fold line to make two shorter rectangles for two blades of grass
- Make the two blades of grass the same way the first blade of grass was made
- Glue the blades of grass on the left and right sides of the first blade of grass; slant them outward a little



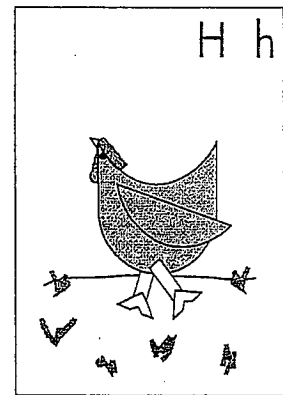
8. Beak: smaller yellow square

- Cut off a corner of the square to make the beak; save the rest of the square to make the eye
- Put a dot of glue on the beak; lift the head; glue the beak under the head with the point sticking up



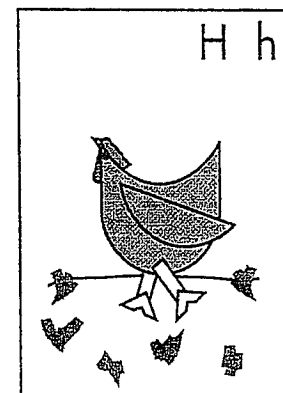
9. Eye: piece saved from Step 7

- Cut off the corners and round to make a circle for the eye
- Put a dot of glue on the eye; glue the eye to the head; place it on the head between the comb and the wattle



10. Eye/base line/grass: green, brown, and black crayons

- Use a black crayon to make a circle on the yellow eye
- Use a brown crayon to draw a base line from one side of the light blue rectangle to the other behind the hen
- Use a green crayon to make some tufts of grass on and below the base line

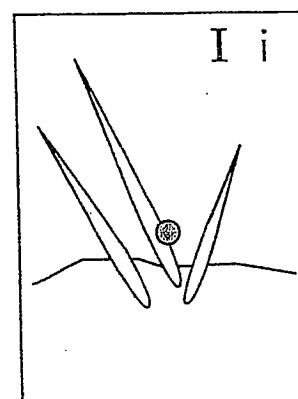


11. Name: pencil

- Turn your picture over and write your name in small letters in the bottom left corner

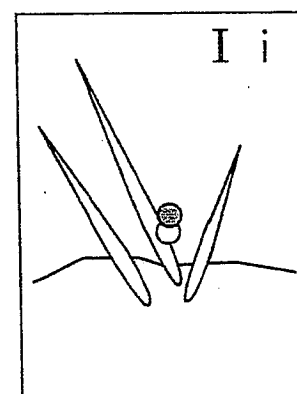
4. Body: long chartreuse rectangle

- Fold the long rectangle in half; open and cut apart on the fold line to make two smaller rectangles; fold one of the smaller rectangles in half; fold it in half again; open and cut apart on the fold lines to make four squares
- Fold the other rectangle twice; make four more squares; you have eight squares for the body segments
- Cut off the corners of one of the squares and round to make a circle
- Put a dot of glue on the circle; glue the circle to the middle blade of grass; place it near the bottom of the blade of grass



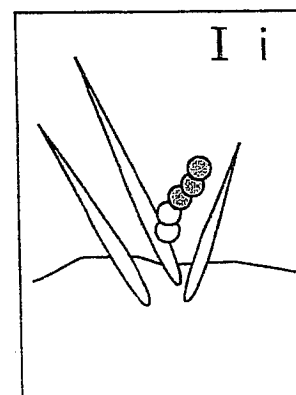
5. Body: chartreuse square from Step 4

- Cut off the corners of the square and round to make a circle
- Put a dot of glue on the circle; glue the circle to the top of the first circle; make it overlap the first circle a little



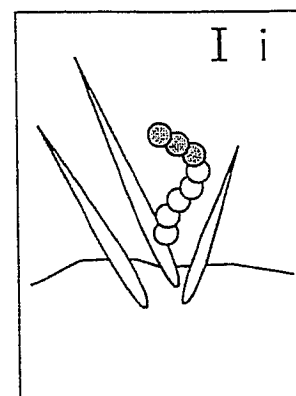
6. Body: three chartreuse squares from Step 4

- Cut off the corners of three more squares to make three circles
- Glue the circles in a row to the second circle; make them slant away from the blade of grass a little; make them overlap a little



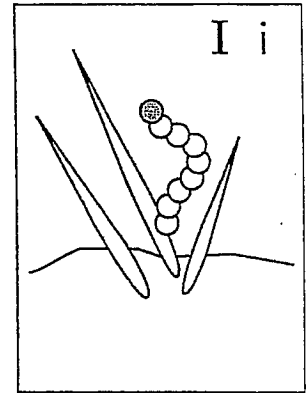
7. Body: three chartreuse squares from Step 4

- Cut off the corners of three more squares to make three circles

- Put a dot of glue on the end of each leg; glue the hooves to the legs in a horizontal position



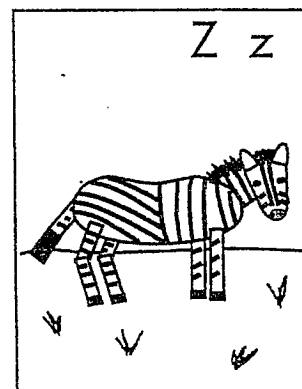
10. Markings: black crayon

- Use a black crayon to make a mane on the top of the neck and top of the head between the ears; make short up-and-down lines to make it look like hair
- Use a black crayon to make two circles for the eyes
- Use a black crayon to make an upside-down "U" for the nose; fill it in very lightly with a black crayon; make two small circles for the nostrils
- Use a black crayon to make two vertical lines from the top of the head to the nose
- Use a black crayon to make two short, horizontal lines on each side of the face below the eyes



11. Markings: black and green crayons

- Use a black crayon to make four black stripes on the tail
- Use a black crayon to make vertical stripes on the front of the body
- Use a black crayon to make slanted stripes on the back of the body
- Use a black crayon to make stripes on the legs
- Use a green crayon to make a horizontal base line from one side of the tan rectangle to the other
- Use a green crayon to make some tufts of grass below the base line
